In this last quarter of 2024, marked by tragic news, escalation of the conflict and continued human loss, we would like to highlight some of the crucial work our grantees are undertaking on the ground

♦ Combatants for Peace (CFP)

In October, Palestinian and Israeli peace activists from <u>CFP</u> — a movement founded by former Israeli soldiers and former Palestinian fighters — led several marches and demonstrations in the West Bank, including a women-led Freedom March in Al-Auja and a protest for water rights there.

They also continued regular solidarity marches in support of villages threatened by settler violence and military zones. During the olive-picking season, Palestinian and Israeli CFP activists provided protective support for Palestinian farmers facing settler violence. They also assisted communities in Masafer Yatta by rebuilding demolished homes and supported shepherds in the Jordan Valley who face daily harassment. Additionally, CFP activists delivered school supplies to the Palestinian village of Jub ad-Dib near Bethlehem.

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Standing Together (ST)

This fall, Standing Together— Israel's fastest-growing Jewish-Arab movement — opened its newest "Purple House" in Jerusalem, following similar community spaces in Haifa and Tel Aviv.

These spaces serve as gathering points for Palestinian and Jewish activists to host events, collaborate, and build local networks. The "Purple Houses" are fast becoming hubs for solidarity, organizing, and community-building.

Often at significant personal risk, ST members have also led numerous protests calling for an end to the war, to stop the killing of innocent civilians in Gaza and secure the safe return of hostages. 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Saving Children Program (Peres Center for Peace and Innovation)

The Saving Children Program provides life-saving medical treatment to Palestinian children in Israeli hospitals. B8 of Hope has been supporting this program since 2017. Unfortunately, its capacity to help as many children as it did before, has been limited in recent months. However, the program continues its essential work.

Since October, it has treated 60 children, performing 90 treatments, including 15 heart surgeries. We remain hopeful that soon, more children will receive treatment in the coming months. For each child we support, we know we're also bringing comfort and hope to their families.



Physician for Human Rights Israel (PHRI)

PHRI has doubled its Mobile Clinic visits in the West Bank and is assisting patients in the most isolated communities facing the gravest movement restrictions and increased violence. PHRI's mobile clinic received 24,476 patient visits (55% were women and 17% were minors) in 76 Mobile Clinics outings.

During each mobile clinics, volunteer doctors and pharmacists work together to provide free medication to the Clinic's patients. Additionally, due to the deepening financial crisis and the growing financial distress of many patients and families losing their income, PHRI provided some patients with extremely costly medication currently unavailable in the West Bank.

In addition to this individual assistance, PHRI continued to provide clinics and hospitals in the West Bank with the most critically needed medical equipment, medication, and consumables.
